## GOSPEL REFLECTION

When the assembly (congregation, “synagogue”) gathers, we come together to be one with the Word of GOD. We hear what has been proclaimed about the Word through the various books (biblia) of Word of GOD. We acknowledge our acceptance of the Word proclaimed by voicing our “Amen” - Yes, I believe, it is so. We hear how the Word applies to our life. We then continue to celebrate the Word with us, so that we can then be “apostled” (“sent out”) to carry the Word with us into the world.

Together our purpose is to bring the Word of GOD (Jesus) to the world. Each of us has a function in the Body of Jesus. We have different ways in which we bring the Word to those with whom we come in contact. Some are gifted with ability to speak eloquently or write in way which make the Word understandable to others. Others are gifted with capacity of making the Word come to life by their actions. The manner in which we proclaim the Word is not important. What is important is that we demonstrate our oneness with the Word, welcoming other members into the Body, all for the glory and praise of GOD.

The only way we can be authentic members of the Body and proclaimers of the Word is to be listeners of the Word, especially as members of a “faith-full” assembly. It is important that we are edified (“built up”) by other true believers, who are united in the Body of the Christ - the Word made flesh. That means we must be people of discernment. We must do our homework. Our homework is to read the Word individually and in community. We pray that we be led into a “faith-filled” community. We also must pray that our community be faithful to the Word.

## READING 1

NEH 8:2-4A, 5-6, 8-10

### A reading from the book of the Prophet Nehemiah.

Ezra the priest brought the law before the assembly, which consisted of men, women, and those children old enough to understand. Standing at one end of the open place that was before the Water Gate, he read out of the book from daybreak till midday, in the presence of the men, the women, and those children old enough to understand; and all the people listened attentively to the book of the law. Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden platform that had been made for the occasion.

He opened the scroll so that all the people might see it — for he was standing higher up than any of the people —; and, as he opened it, all the people rose. Ezra blessed the LORD, the great God, and all the people, their hands raised high, answered, "Amen, amen!" Then they bowed down and prostrated themselves before the LORD, their faces to the ground.

## READING 2

1 COR 12:12-14, 27

### A reading from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians.

Brothers and sisters:

As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ.

For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit.

Now the body is not a single part, but many. You are Christ's body, and individually parts of it.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

*Glory be to You, Lord.*

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all. He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written: The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord. Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He said to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."
