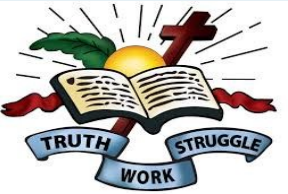

GOSPEL

LK 2:15-20

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke.

Glory be to You, Lord.

When the angels went away from them to heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go, then, to Bethlehem to see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went in haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the infant lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known the message that had been told them about this child. All who heard it were amazed by what had been told them by the shepherds. And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart. Then the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, just as it had been told to them.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
Praise be to You, Lord Jesus Christ.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Words cannot fully capture what the Word becoming Flesh means for us. GOD is truly Emmanuel (“GOD with us”) in and through Jesus. Jesus is “GOD saving.” He is the “Anointed One” (Messiah, Christ). We truly have become daughters and sons of GOD because GOD the Son has come to share our humanity with us and allow us to be gifted with divine life.

May we continue to celebrate that the Love of GOD has taken flesh
and “pitched His tent” among us.**

The readings for the Mass at dawn begin with Isaiah telling the people to rejoice for the Savior comes. St. Paul, again writing to Titus, reminds us that we have been saved because the kindness/love of GOD has allowed the Savior to be born. The Gospel for this liturgy continues the infancy account according to Luke. The shepherds go to see the baby in the manger and believe. Mary reflects on the events that have happened.
