Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."

GOSPEL REFLECTION

In the Gospel, Jesus takes on the characteristics of the new Moses. He ascends the mountainside and hands down a new set of commandments. St. Matthew builds on the image of Jesus as the new Moses in the way he sets up his Gospel. There are five sections, paralleling the five books of Moses. Each ends in a similar way. Jesus is the fulfillment of the Mosaic Law. Jesus gives new guidelines for His disciples to follow. And the new guidelines speak about being humble, yet active.

As we look more closely at the Beatitudes, we see the first few Beatitudes speak about people who are like the outcast. They are the poor, the sorrowing, the lowly, the hungry and the thirsty. They are the people who are lowly. They understand that even in their state (and maybe because of their state), they are loved by GOD and will continue to be blessed by GOD. They are humble in that they realize what they are in GOD's eyes. Although in need, they know GOD will take care of them. They humbly place their trust in a GOD Who is all-powerful and Who loves them.
