GOSPEL MT 17:1-9

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Glory be to You, Lord.

And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Lord, it is good that we are here. While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid." And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone.

As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

The Gospel of the Lord. *Praise be to You, Lord Jesus Christ.*

GOSPEL REFLECTION

The Gospel of the Second Sunday in Lent, in all three liturgical cycles, is always that of the Transfiguration. Jesus takes His three closest disciples (disciplined learners) and is changed (transfigured, transformed) before their eyes. He becomes as radiant as light. Moses and Elijah appear with Him. The disciples are overwhelmed. A voice from the clouds and declares: "This is My beloved Son on whom My favor rests." The Transfiguration is "sandwiched" between two predictions of Jesus' suffering and death (not part of today's Gospel selection).

As I reflect on the readings for this Sunday, I come to the theme of GOD's calling us to holiness and giving us hope of glory. We are called by GOD, just as Abraham was called. We don't always know where our paths will lead us. We are asked, like Abraham was asked, to put our trust and hope in a GOD Who leads us along a way of holiness, that includes suffering and death, but ultimately will lead to life and full relationship with GOD. Holiness is the realization of our being in relationship with GOD.
