GOSPEL

JN 10:1-10

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John.

Glory be to You, Lord.

Jesus said:

"Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber. But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers."

Although Jesus used this figure of speech, the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them. So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly."

GOSPEL REFLECTION

In the tenth chapter of St. John's Gospel we see Jesus portrayed as the GOoD Shepherd, the One Who calls each sheep and leads all His flock to safety. Jesus also is the Sheep Gate. Thus we hear how the GOoD Shepherd has a personal relationship with His sheep (they knowing Him as He calls our their name); the GOoD Shepherd is willing to lay down His life for the protection of the sheep; and He leads the flock to verdant pastures.

As I reflect on the role of the GOoD Shepherd and the response that should come from the sheep under the care of the GOoD Shepherd, I am humbled and edified. Jesus is concerned for each of us in a very personal, intimate way. Jesus knows each of us. He is willing to do whatever is necessary so that not one of His flock is lost or hurt. We should not worry about anything if we truly know the voice of our GOoD Shepherd and respond to His call. Our GOoD Shepherd will provide for us.
