GOSPEL REFLECTION

Jesus, in our Gospel, reminds His disciples that just as He has come to instruct and teach His followers, another "Paraclete" will come after He is gone. Paraclete (παράκλητος - paracletos) means "advocate" or "instructor." Advocates had two roles in ancient times: first, to defend and help those who were facing trial; and second, to instruct their clients in the matters at hand. Jesus was the first Paraclete for His followers. The Holy Spirit is the "other" Paraclete Who will continue to defend, strengthen, help, and instruct those who have been marked by the Spirit.

In the Catholic tradition, the further outpouring of the Holy Spirit is celebrated in the Church in many ways: in the feast of Pentecost (in two weeks), in the constant guidance and outpouring of the gifts of the Spirit, and in the second of the three sacraments of initiation (Confirmation).
