GOSPEL REFLECTION

Jesus relates three parables in the Gospel. Each of them speaks about the price of being a part of the Reign of GOD. It takes wisdom and costly choices on the part of those who want to be a part of the Reign of GOD. It means giving up all other values in order to be a part of GOD and the divine plan. The Reign of GOD in our lives is both demanding and rewarding. It is not something which comes easy or without a price. If we really want to be part of GOD's plan, it means we have to have wisdom. That wisdom will lead us to make right choices. Wisdom will also help us to see the big picture. Sometimes we get so caught up with the little picture that we fail to see GOD's wisdom in action. We focus on our own suffering and problems and do not see that GOD is at work even in, and especially during, those difficult times in our lives. GOD loves us and wants us to be a part of the divine plan.

The Lord Jesus says it will take a full commitment on our part. We must be willing to give up all the things that we hold as valuable in order to buy into this treasure beyond all other treasures. It means that in the face of difficulties, we will have to fully trust in the LORD, believing that GOD will make everything turn out right in the end. It also means we have to be patient in order to see the fulfillment of GOD's plan.
