GOSPEL

MT 14:22-33

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Glory be to You, Lord.

After he had fed the people, Jesus made the disciples get into a boat and precede him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening he was there alone.

Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it. During the fourth watch of the night, he came toward them walking on the sea. When the disciples saw him walking on the sea they were terrified. "It is a ghost," they said, and they cried out in fear. At once Jesus spoke to them, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid." Peter said to him in reply, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught Peter, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" After they got into the boat, the wind died down. Those who were in the boat did him homage, saying, "Truly, you are the Son of God."

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Jesus today reveals His presence with His disciples as they are being battered about by the winds and waves during a horrific storm on the Sea of Galilee. When they first become aware of Jesus, they think they are hallucinating. Even after Jesus reassures them that it is He, they doubt. Presumptuous Peter challenges Jesus by saying, "Lord, if it is really You, command me to come to You on the water." Jesus beckons Peter forth. For a while Peter does fine walking on the stormy sea. Yet, as he losses his focus on Jesus and looks at the stormy waters, he starts to sink. Jesus chides him for his lack of faith and failure to accept the presence of GOD with him. I wonder how many times I have missed experiencing the presence of GOD. I know that GOD is omnipresent (present everywhere), but I am sure there have been times when I was expecting GOD to manifest the divine presence in one way (as Elijah was expecting in the First Reading) and I missed out on the LORD's self-revelation in other, more subtle ways. The challenge for me is to be open to GOD's being with me at all times. I must keep my eyes open and expect the unexpected.
