GOSPEL

MT 22:34-40

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Glory be to You, Lord.

Jesus told his disciples this parable:

"The kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were wise. The foolish ones, when taking their lamps, brought no oil with them, but the wise brought flasks of oil with their lamps. Since the bridegroom was long delayed, they all became drowsy and fell asleep.

At midnight, there was a cry, 'Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!'
Then all those virgins got up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish ones said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' But the wise ones replied, 'No, for there may not be enough for us and you. Go instead to the merchants and buy some for yourselves.' While they went off to buy it, the bridegroom came and those who were ready went into the wedding feast with him. Then the door was locked.

Afterwards the other virgins came and said, 'Lord, Lord, open the door for us!' But he said in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, I do not know you.' Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour."

GOSPEL REFLECTION

In the Gospel today, Matthew shares with us Jesus' parable of the ten virgins awaiting the coming of the Bridegroom. This is the only Gospel which has this parable. A few things can be taken from the parable. First, Jesus may not come back when some people expect Him. (This is something that Paul learned from his ministry.) Another important message is that those who wait for the Lord Jesus must be prepared no matter when or under what circumstances He returns.

As I pondered the readings today, I was directed to the idea of prayer. Prayer is the seeking of the Lord Jesus, His Abba-Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit. It is something that must be part of a believer's daily life, hourly life, minute-by-minute life. Prayer is something of which we must be conscious at all times. We must be vigilant. Prayer is a relationship with GOD. We must seek the Lord Jesus through prayer. And GOD is always ready to reveal the fullness of the divinity to those who turned their eyes to GOD, even if the revelation is done over the course of one's life.
