REAFFIRMATION OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

Standing at the baptismal font if it is in the front of the church or at the lectern, the celebrant leads the reaffirmation of baptismal vows. If desired, each member of the congregation holds a lighted candle. The celebrant addresses the congregation in these or similar words.

My dear brothers and sisters:

In this most sacred night (time), we recall the death and burial of our Lord Jesus Christ. In return for His great love, we keep watch. And, celebrating His glorious resurrection, we are filled with joy that knows no end. As the Apostle Paul teaches, by our baptism we have been buried with Christ into death. As Christ has risen from the dead, by our baptism we too are raised up to walk in newness of life. We know that by baptism our old self has been crucified with Christ, so that we may no longer be slaves to sin. Let us remember, then, that we have died to sin, and are to live for God, in Christ Jesus, our Lord.

Now that we have completed our preparation during this Great and Holy Lent, let us reaffirm the promises of our baptism, by which we once renounced all evil and turned our backs to that world which is the enemy of God, and promised to serve God faithfully in the Holy Catholic Church.

Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." Matthew 28:18b-20

Having, therefore, such assurance from the Savior Himself, that He is with all the apostles, when they are gathered together, but not with one individual apostle only, let us strengthen our faith that it is His will that the Holy Spirit should reveal Himself to His Church. Such a revelation takes place not in one person, but rather in the gathering of those who represent the Church.

Let us also strengthen our faith in the teaching that, if our

Then God said, "Let the earth bring forth all kinds of living creatures: cattle, creeping things, and wild animals of all kinds." And so it happened: God made all kinds of wild animals, all kinds of cattle, and all kinds of creeping things of the earth. God saw how good it was.

Then God said: "Let us make man in Our image, after Our likeness. Let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and the cattle, and over all the wild animals and all the creatures that crawl on the ground."

God created man in His image; in the divine image He created him; male and female He created them.

God blessed them, saying: "Be fertile and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it. Have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and all the living things that move on the earth." God also said: "See, I give you every seed-bearing plant all over the earth and every tree that has seed-bearing fruit on it to be your food; and to all the animals of the land, all the birds of the air, and all the living creatures that crawl on the ground, I give all the green plants for food." And so it happened.

God looked at everything He had made, and He found it very good. Evening came, and morning followed—the sixth day.

Thus the heavens and the earth and all their array were completed. Since on the seventh day God was finished with the work He had been doing, He rested on the seventh day from all the work He had undertaken.

THE FOURTH EXHORTATION

Beloved, we also have assurance from Jesus Christ Himself, that all nations will unite in His Church and that He will not forsake His Church. He tells us lovingly: "I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you." John 14:18

And He will come if we ask in faith, and not wait for Him to ask His Father in heaven for us. We are to ask, not separately but as united in one brotherhood, joined by His love into a Holy Church, taking its mission from God through Jesus Christ, enjoined to the Apostles: "Whoever listens to you listens to Me." Luke 10:16a "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven and whose sins you retain are retained." John 20:23 "Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." Matthew 16:19b

The Savior Himself will intercede before His Father on behalf of the Apostles and all those who through them shall believe in Him. He said: "Father, the hour has come. THE SECOND EXHORTATION

Listen to what Holy Scripture tells us about bringing forth the universe from God's Spirit and pointing out to man that he is dust of the earth physically, yet a part of God through His spirit which was breathed into him by God. The blessed Apostle Paul writes:

"In times past God spoke in partial and various ways to our ancestors through the prophets; in these last days, He spoke to us through a Son, Whom He made Heir of all things and through Whom He created the universe, Who is the refulgence of His glory, the very imprint of His being, and Who sustains all things by His mighty word. When He accomplished purification from sins, He took His seat at the right hand of the Majesty on high."

Hebrews 1:1-3

The blessed Evangelist John, reaching for the beginnings of eternity and led by God's Spirit, says:

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came to be through Him and without Him nothing came to be. What came to be through Him was life, and this life was the light of the human race; the light shines in darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

"A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

"He was in the world, and the world came to be through Him, but the world did not know Him. He came to what was His own, but His own people did not accept Him.

"But to those who did accept Him He gave power to become children of God, to those who believe in His name, who were born not by natural generation nor by human choice nor by a man's decision but of God.

"And the Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us, and we saw His glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth."

John testified to Him and cried out saying, "This was He

revealed in the final time. In this you rejoice, although now for a little while you may have to suffer through various trials, so that the genuineness of your faith, more precious than gold, that is perishable even though tested by fire, may prove to be for praise, glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ. Although you have not seen Him you love Him; even though you do not see Him now yet believe in Him, you rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy, as you attain the goal of [your] faith, the salvation of your souls. Concerning this salvation, the prophets, who prophesied about the grace that was to be yours, made careful search and inquiry."

1 Peter 1:5-10

The Savior Himself tells us: "I am the true vine, and My Father is the vine-grower. He takes away every branch in Me that does not bear fruit, and everyone that does He prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in Me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in Me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in Me and I in him will bear much fruit because without Me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in Me will be thrown out like a branch and wither; people will gather them and throw them into a fire and they will be burned. If you remain in Me and My words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. By this is My Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become My disciples. As the Father loves Me, so I also love you. Remain in My love. If you keep My commandments, you will remain in My love, just as I have

About all of these things the Apostle John says, "What was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we looked upon and touched with our hands concerns the Word of Life—for the life was made

visible; we have seen it and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was made visible to us—what we have seen and heard we proclaim now to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; for our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son, Jesus Christ. We are writing this so that our joy may be complete. Now this is the message that we have heard from Him and proclaim to you: God is light and in Him there is no darkness at all. If we say, "We have fellowship with Him, while we continue to walk in darkness, we lie and do not act in truth but if we walk in the light, then we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of His Son Jesus cleanses us from all sin." 1 John 1:1-7

THE THIRD EXHORTATION

Beloved, we are comforted that God, our Father, not only showed Himself as our highest goal, but also left us an abundant teaching of how we are to strive toward this goal. This is what our Lord Jesus Christ says of Himself: "I am the way and the truth and the life." John 14:6a

How are we to go along this way which is often winding, difficult and narrow? Where are we to seek the truth that is often unreachable by the human mind? How are we to find eternal life? God established the way and means by which these are to be found in the inexhaustible riches of His Church, whose cornerstone is Jesus Christ.

This is what He said about Himself: "Upon this rock I will build My Church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it." Matthew 16:18b What is this rock? It is the faith of Simon the Apostle, called Peter (Cefas), that Jesus is the Son of God. This faith does not flow from the wisdom of man, from the human mind, but rather from the Revelation of God the Father, Who is in heaven. Therefore, whoever lives abundantly in this revealed faith that Jesus Christ is the Son of God is also a component of the foundation of the Church of Jesus Christ and a participant in God's kingdom.
