**GOSPEL** MK 4:26-34

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark.

Glory be to You, Lord.

Jesus said to the crowds:

"This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come."

He said, "To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade."

With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.

**The Gospel of the Lord.** *Praise be to You, Lord Jesus Christ.* 

#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

In the Gospel, Jesus points out that once a seed is sown in the ground, GOD allows the seed to grow and eventually produce a rich harvest, many times the original seed. Although people did not understand the full botanical processes which are involved, they were familiar with the stages a seed goes through as it sprouts, grows leaves, and produces grain. In a similar way, GOD allows growth to take place in those who are part of the Reign of GOD. GOD is the giver of life and growth. We enjoy the benefits of the whole growth process.

In the second parable, Jesus uses the mustard seed to show how something small and seemingly insignificant can grow into a shrub which provides shelter for the birds. A mustard seed is about the size of period at the end of sentence of 24 point type. Yet it can produce both a spice that is highly desired and also enough shade and protection for many birds.
