GOSPEL

MK 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark.

Glory be to You, Lord.

At that time, John said to Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us." Jesus replied, "Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me. For whoever is not against us is for us. Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward.

"Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life maimed than with two hands to go into Gehenna, into the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to sin, cut if off. It is better for you to enter into life crippled than with two feet to be thrown into Gehenna. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. Better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into Gehenna, where 'their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched.'"

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

The Gospel today introduces some of the sayings of Jesus, of which the first parallels the reading from Numbers. In those verses the apostle John is concerned because some individuals (who are not part of the regular disciples of Jesus) are performing mighty deeds in Jesus' name. Jesus responds that anyone who does GOoD in His name is furthering the GOoD News and will be rewarded for doing so. In contrast, Jesus declares anyone who misleads even a child down the wrong path is doing a terrible thing and will have to answer for their mis-guidance of others. Jesus condemns the person to a fate which was inconceivably horrible to the Jews of His day – being drowned in the sea. The last section of today's Gospel pericope focuses on the need of a disciple of Jesus to avoid all occasions of sinfulness. Jesus cautions that it would be better for a person to cut out whatever is a possible source of sin in one's life rather than to face the fires of
