GOSPEL MK 13:24-32

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark.

Glory be to You, Lord.

Jesus said to his disciples: "In those days after that tribulation the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. "And then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with great power and glory, and then he will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the end of the earth to the end of the sky.

"Learn a lesson from the fig tree. When its branch becomes tender and sprouts leaves, you know that summer is near. In the same way, when you see these things happening, know that he is near, at the gates. Amen, I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. "But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father."

GOSPEL REFLECTION

In Mark's Gospel, today's passage is part of the "apocalyptic" chapter 13. It speaks of distressful times when Jesus' disciples will experience persecution. Yet there will come a time, Jesus promises, when He will return in the glory of the "Son of Man" and will judge all peoples, calling the elect into His Reign. Although the signs of the "end times" are evident in events that have happened, the fullness of the end of time is not able to be calculated by anyone except Jesus' Abba-Father. Even Jesus during His earthly sojourn does not know the exact moment of the final judgment. The passage ends with Jesus giving a warning to His disciples to always be prepared for the end times.

It is important for us to realize as we reflect on today's apocalyptic readings that they are truly pieces of divine revelation. As with all of scripture, there is Truth in them. Many biblical scholars also admit that they are symbolic in that they often were written to give hope to the people of the time of the writing, using terms which mask what was happening at the time of the writing. Yet in them can be found the universal Truth which spans beyond the period in which the author and his audience lived.
