# **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

Today's focus is on family life, with the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph taking the center role as can be seen in the Gospel. The Gospel relates the events when Jesus was about twelve years old and stayed in the Temple while Mary and Joseph journeyed home.

The theme of family relationships is seen in one of the Hebrew Scripture (First Reading) from the Book of Sirach. In this book we hear how parents have received a special position from GOD in relationship to their children. The role of parents comes from GOD. As I reflect on this, I realized that parents have an obligation to reflect the love of GOD the Abba-Father. They receive their example of how to love and care from the way the First Person of the Blessed Trinity loves and cares.
