GOSPEL

LK 3:15-16, 21-22

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke.

Glory be to You, Lord.

The people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ.

John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."

After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise be to You, Lord Jesus Christ.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

As I reflect on this Epiphany of Jesus in the water of River Jordan, I am awe-struck by the scene. John the Baptist has been announcing the coming of the One Who would fulfill the promises of old. The One Who is coming is greater than John. Jesus humbly enters the river and John proceeds to baptize Him. (In Matthew's version of the account, John protests that Jesus should be baptizing him instead of John baptizing Jesus.) As Jesus emerges from the water, the sky opens and the Holy Spirit is seen as a dove (a symbol of Shalom [peace] and new life [paralleling the events after waters recedes in the re-creation after the Flood]). GOD's voice is heard affirming the Sonship of Jesus and that GOD's favor (blessing, grace, power) rests in Him.

For Jesus, His baptism is not so much for His sake, for He is already one with His Abba and the Holy Spirit. His baptism is a manifestation of the relationship which already exists. It is also a public commissioning of Jesus. Jesus is officially and publicly being sent out on His mission — to proclaim the GOoD News of GOD's salvation in and through Jesus. GOD the Abba is acknowledging in the sight of the people that Jesus is the Son of GOD Who is to bring the message of salvation to the people.
