GOSPEL LK 2:22-32

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke.

Glory be to You, Lord.

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord, and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord.

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the Temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying:

"Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

GOSPEL REFLECTION

The couple and their Baby are greeted by two holy persons who sense the importance of the Infant Who is being presented. Simeon had been told by the Holy Spirit that he would not experience death until he had seen the Anointed of the Lord (the Messiah, the Christ). Simeon praises GOD and says he is now ready for death since he has seen "a revealing light for the Gentiles and the glory of GOD's people, Israel." Simeon goes on to say to Mary that the Baby she holds in her hands will be the downfall and rise of many in Israel and that Mary's own life will experience hardships because of the Infant, not by her Child, but because of the opposition to her Child.

The second holy person to encounter the Infant and to speak about Him is the prophetess, Anna. She also gives thanks to GOD as she recognizes that the Baby will be the source of deliverance for GOD's holy people.
