# A reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Romans.

Brothers and sisters:

Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life. For if we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection.

We know that our old self was crucified

**GOSPEL** JN 6:37-40

#### A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. John.

#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

In the Gospel, Jesus proclaims that He has come to do the will of His Abba-Father. Part of the will of GOD includes His raising up all who believe in Him and share in His life (death, and resurrection). With all this in mind, we turn to today's celebration – All Souls (All the Faithful Departed). Today we show our union with those who have died and are making the transition to the fullness of GOD's presence. Our prayers and love (both of which are gifts originating in GOD) are part of what unites us with our loved ones on the final steps of their journey to the home of our Lord Jesus and His Abba. Also it is important for us to realize that after death, the time-space constraints we experience on earth are gone. What seems like a thousand years to us on earth is only a brief "moment" for those who are no longer bound by time-space barriers but are beginning to live eternally.

Death, then, is a transition from earthly life to eternal life. Part of the that transition is a realization of what our life has been, and recognition of the times when we have not always matched up to the plan of GOD. In that transition known as death, GOD's love purifies (purges) us so that we can enjoy the fullness of the eternal life which Jesus has gained for us through His death and resurrection. Death can be scary, particularly as we realize our own imperfections. Yet, the belief we have as imperfect (but striving to be faithful) disciples of the Lord Jesus, is that Jesus' obedience to the will of His Abba has raised us up and opened to us the fullness of eternal life.
