GOSPEL MT 1:18-24

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Glory be to You, Lord.

This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the Holy Spirit. Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly. Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus,

because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means "God is with us."

When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. *Praise be to You, Lord Jesus Christ.*

GOSPEL REFLECTION

As you continue your process of preparing for the First Coming (Advent) of Jesus in His human nature (Christmas), may you take the time to reflect on what it means that the Son of GOD has humbled Himself and taken on our nature, being born as an Infant, and living in the human condition.

It is so easy to get caught up in the externals of Christmas. Obviously they help to make this season so special. We enjoy the colored lights, the food, the cards, the Christmas carols, the presents, and the Christmas trees. It is important, however, to take the time to focus on what we are celebrating: GOD's love manifested in the Son of GOD becoming human and sharing life with us, and for us. The Almighty and Eternal GOD has chosen to enter history and limit Himself in the person of Jesus, born of the Virgin Mary. It was a total absurdity for those to whom the event was first announced and proclaimed. We cannot take it for granted. We must try to comprehend how awesome the Incarnation of Jesus is.
