R: He saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He richly poured out on us through Jesus Christ our Savior.

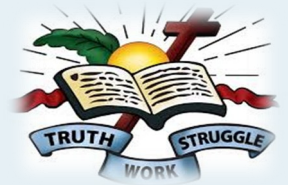
C: Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

READING 1

A reading from the Book of Exodus.

Early in the morning Moses went up Mount Sinai as the LORD had commanded him, taking along the two stone tablets. Having come down in a cloud, the LORD stood with Moses there and proclaimed his name, "LORD." GOSPEL

JN 3:16-18

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John.

Glory be to You, Lord.

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.

The Gospel of the Lord. *Praise be to You, Lord Jesus Christ.*

GOSPEL REFLECTION

On this Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, the Gospel reveals one of the most beautiful and profound truths of our faith: God's very nature is love. "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son." These words remind us that the story of salvation begins not with human effort, but with God's initiative. The Father loves the world, the Son is given for the world, and the Holy Spirit continues to draw people into that divine life. The Holy Trinity is not merely a theological doctrine to be studied; it is the living mystery of a God who desires a relationship with His people. The Father creates us, the Son redeems us, and the Holy Spirit sanctifies us. Every blessing, every grace, and every moment of salvation flows from the loving communion of the Triune God.

The Gospel also reminds us that Jesus was not sent to condemn the world, but to save it. Too often people imagine God primarily as a judge waiting to punish. Yet Christ reveals the heart of the Father - a God who seeks to rescue, heal, forgive, and restore. Salvation is offered freely, but it must be received through faith. To believe in Christ is not simply to accept certain truths about Him; it is to entrust our lives to Him and to allow His love to transform us. On this feast of the Holy Trinity, we are invited to reflect on the incredible dignity of our calling: through Baptism we have been welcomed into the very life of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The more we live in that relationship, the more we become witnesses of God's love to the world around us.
